

REQUIREMENTS FOR RESEARCH PAPERS PUBLISHED IN JOURNAL “GENDER STUDIES AND RESEARCH”

The journal “Gender Studies and Research” publishes research papers on the results of humanities, social sciences and original gender studies and innovations done by authors. Research papers written in Lithuanian and English are accepted. The text should be formatted in one column and laid on A4 size paper, single spacing. Margins: 2x2x2x2 cm, text editor – Microsoft Word, Times New Roman. The text must be revised by language editor before giving it to Editorial Office. Submitted papers are reviewed by two reviewers who are invited by the journal Editorial Board. Reviewing is anonymous. To facilitate the reviewing procedure, the author of the text name, surname and institution must be indicated on a separate home page.

1. Home page. Author of the paper in this home page writes his degree, name and surname, institution in which he study or work and his position, scientific research interests, e-mail, and telephone number in Lithuanian and English languages.
2. Submission requirements:
 - Title of the paper (14 pt, Bold)
 - Paper abstract in Lithuanian language (about 150-250 words) (title – 11 pt, Bold text 10 pt, Normal)
 - Key words (3-7 words) (title – 10 pt, Bold, text – 10 pt, Normal)
 - Body (3500-7000 words without bibliography) (sections titles 12 pt, Bold; text 11 pt, Normal)
 - Paper summary in English language (about 1000-1500 words for papers which are in written in English language and not less than 1500 words for papers written in Lithuanian language) (title – 11 pt, Bold; text - 10 pt, Normal)
 - References
 - Bibliography. Bibliographical references should be given in the original language of the sources (title – 11 pt, Bold; text – 10 pt, Normal or Italic)
3. Two copies of the Paper prepared and printed by indicated requirements and also electronical version of the paper is to be sent to the Editorial Board by mail and e-mail.
4. **Requirements for references in the text:**

Citing possibilities	Example
Reference to a publication by one author: (Author’s surname, year)	The study (Smith, 2009) revealed that... According to Brown (2009), ...
References to different publications by different authors are separated by semicolons	Researches (Smith, 2009; Brown, 2010; Gary, 2008) suggest ... In the works by Smith (2009) and Brown (2010) ...
When there are 3 or more authors	First reference: Smith, Brown and Gary (2010). Further in the text: Smith et al. (2010).
When the author of a publication is an organization or it has no author	It has been found (Lithuanian Department of Statistics, 2008) that ...
When the publication has no author and its title is long	Profit increased (Company Financial Indicators ..., 2007)
Different publications by the same author with the same year of publication	This idea is pointed out by several researchers (Smith, 2005a, 2005b, 2005c; Johnson, 2008a, 2008b).
Exact citation of other author (up to 40 words)	“learning is a continuous process” (Gary and Smith, 2008, p. 156).
Citation of a legal act or other	(Zin., 2008, No. 48-1857)

Note: secondary source is included in the list of references (Brown, 2010).

Seidenberg and McClelland (2006), cited by Brown (2008), found that...

Items on the list of references must be listed in the source language, in **alphabetical order**, Latin script first (e.g. Lithuanian, English) followed by other scripts (e.g. Russian). Extensive use of sources cited in Thomson Reuters (<http://science.thomsonreuters.com>) is mandatory.

5. Requirements for bibliographical references:

- Books. Surname of the author(s), first name(s) initial(s), year of publication, title, place of publication (city), publishing house, e. g.: Čekanavičius, V., Murauskas, G. (2001). *Statistika ir jos taikymai*. T. 1. Vilnius: TEV leidykla.
 - Journal articles. Surname of the author, first name initial, year of publication, title of the article, title of the journal, volume number, issue number, first and last pages, e. g.: Fagerberg, J. (1988). International Competitiveness. *The Economic Journal*, No. 98 (June), p. 355–374.
 - Conference proceedings, selection of papers. Surname of the author, first name initial, year of publication, title of the article, pages, place of publication, publishing house, e. g.: Jucevičius, R. (1992). Valdymo reorganizavimo prielaidos. *Vadyba ir rinkos ekonomika: tarptautinės konferencijos pranešimų medžiaga* (p. 15–19). Kaunas: Technologija.
 - Newspaper articles. Surname of the author, first name initial, year of publication, month, day, title of the article, title of the newspaper, page, e. g.: Pavilionis, R. Neišprusimo problemų joks teismas neišspręs. (2001 spalio 26). *Lietuvos rytas*, p. 4.
 - Pd. D thesis. Surname of the author, first name initial, year, title, place, e. g.: Gudavičius, A. (1994). *Ekonominių veiksnių įtaka Lietuvos demografiniai situacijai* (Doctoral dissertation, Vilniaus universitetas, 1994).
 - Internet. Title of the cited source and full address, e. g.: Drake, P. A. *Primer on Competitiveness*. EDCO Ontario’s Economic Development Network, <http://www.edco.on.ca/journal/story31.htm> [retrieved 2007-09-15].
6. Tables in the text should be given Arabic numerals. The word ‘Table’ and number are placed at the right margin of the text, the title of the table (11 pt, Bold) centred, new paragraph. The text within the table: 10 pt, Normal.
7. Pictures in the text are given Arabic numerals. The word ‘**Fig.**’, number (11 pt, Bold) and title (11 pt, Normal) are placed below the picture. Pictures should be prepared so that font changes and corrections could be made. Pictures, graphs and diagrams are to be prepared in black and white.
8. Papers improved in accordance with the reviewers’ comments are submitted by e-mail (electronic version) to the Editorial Board. Final decision on publication is made by the Editorial Board. Papers not conforming to the requirements set for scientific articles (lexis, word formation, grammar rules, and scientific style) or prepared inaccurately are returned to their contributors without evaluation.
9. Reviews of the scientific journal are also published in the journal.
